Thanks to funding from the Trussell Trust's Financial Inclusion Project, Hope Nottingham has been able to facilitate weekly drop-in advice sessions at several of our food banks. Citizens Advice Broxtowe and Step Forward Money Advice are providing drop in sessions at Hope House, Beeston; The Ark Advice Centre providing sessions at our Carlton Community Hub; and Nottingham Citizens Advice at our Aspley and Broxtowe food banks.

We look forward to exploring further ways of working more closely with other advice agencies to improve access to advice across our food bank network.

Donations and Christmas opening hours


